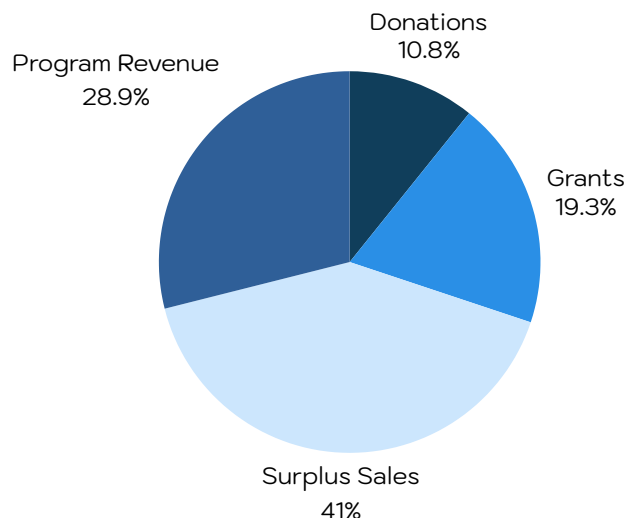

Digital Bridges Forsyth	Contract with Digital Bridges Forsyth to train instructors and provide digital skills curriculum and computers.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 426 individuals participated in 2023. 66% of participants did not own a computer before participating in the program. 89% felt confident using a computer after taking the class.
Connecting Minority Communities	Sub-recipient of NTIA grant through North Carolina Central University to provide digital skills training and computers.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 157 individuals participated in 2023. 48% of participants identified as Hispanic or Latino. 72% felt confident using a computer after taking the class.
Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) Outreach	FCC Grant to inform and enroll households into the ACP.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 13,894 individuals reached with info about ACP. 77 households enrolled in ACP by Kramden.

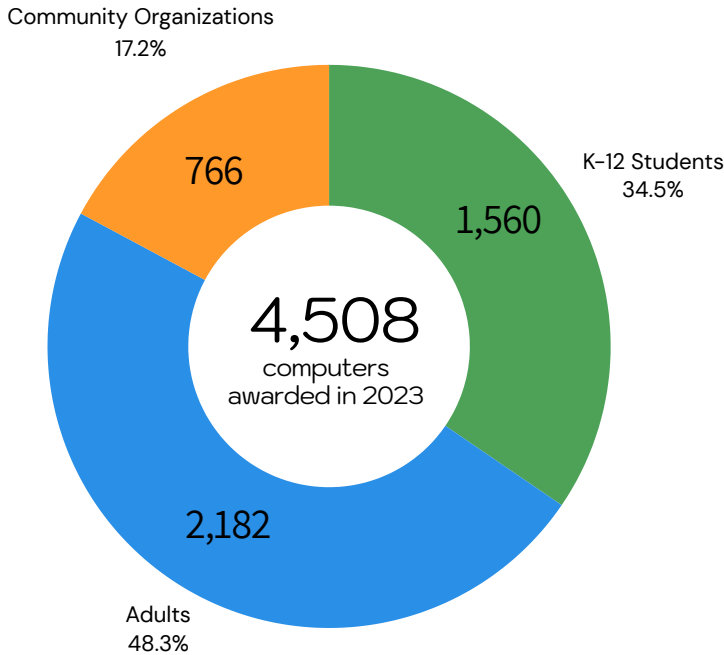
Funding summary

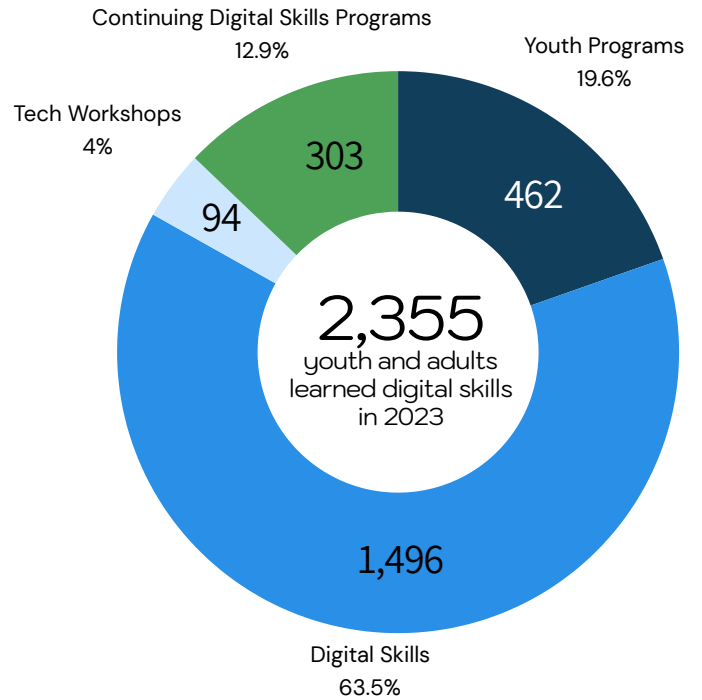

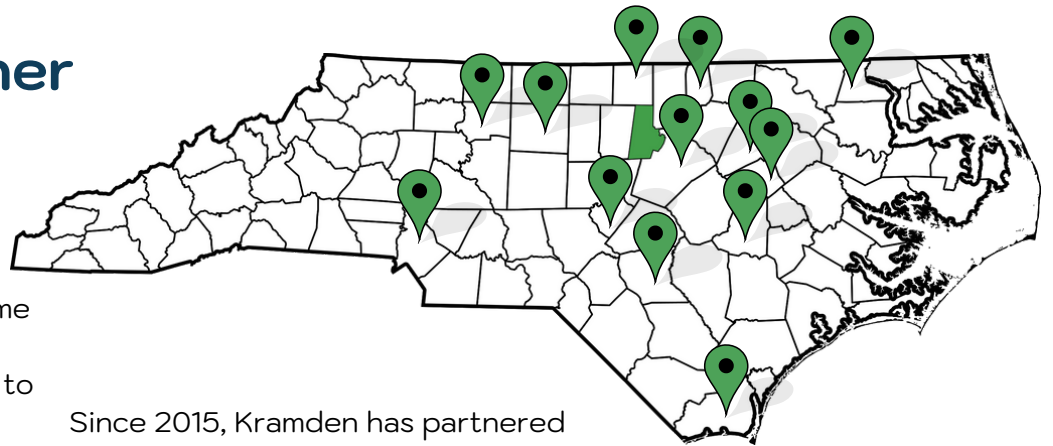

Train-The-Trainer

Train-the-Trainer is Kramden’s approach to bringing Computer Basics classes to more people in North Carolina. Community Technology Instructors (CTIs) come to Kramden’s location in Durham, where our instructors train them to teach the Computer Basics curriculum. CTIs return to their communities to train others in digital skills.



Since 2015, Kramden has partnered with multiple agencies to provide digital literacy training using this model.
